

Creative Circles

Today we are going to be creating creative circles, this exercise allows us to be as expressive and free as we like within the confines of the circle. The aim of the exercise is too fill the entire circle with as much colour, or shape or texture as possible. Below are several examples, but you should use your own inspiration and imagination to create your circle.

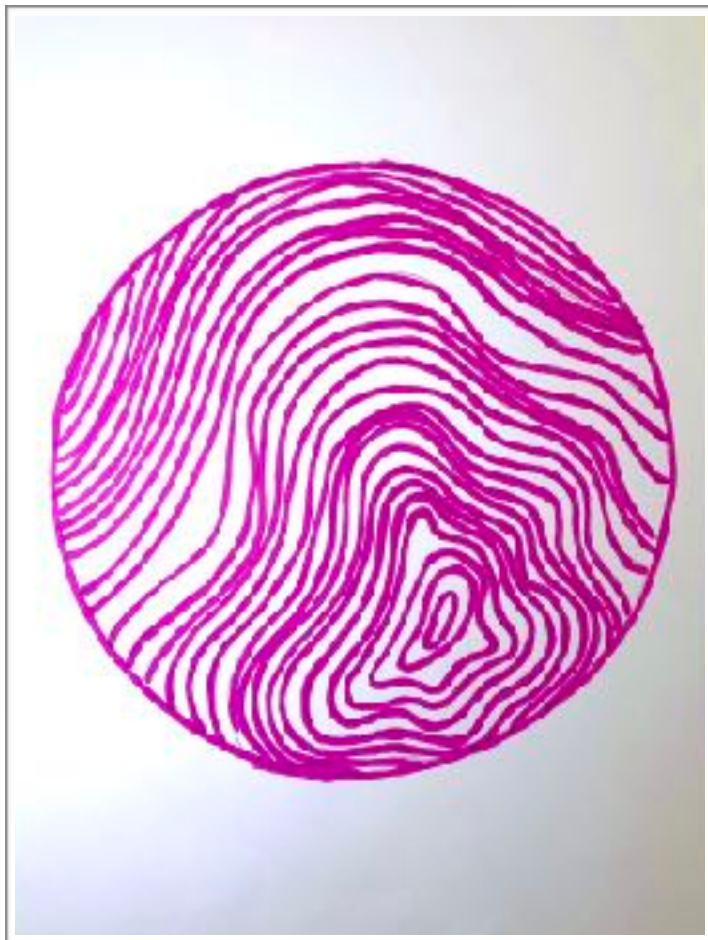
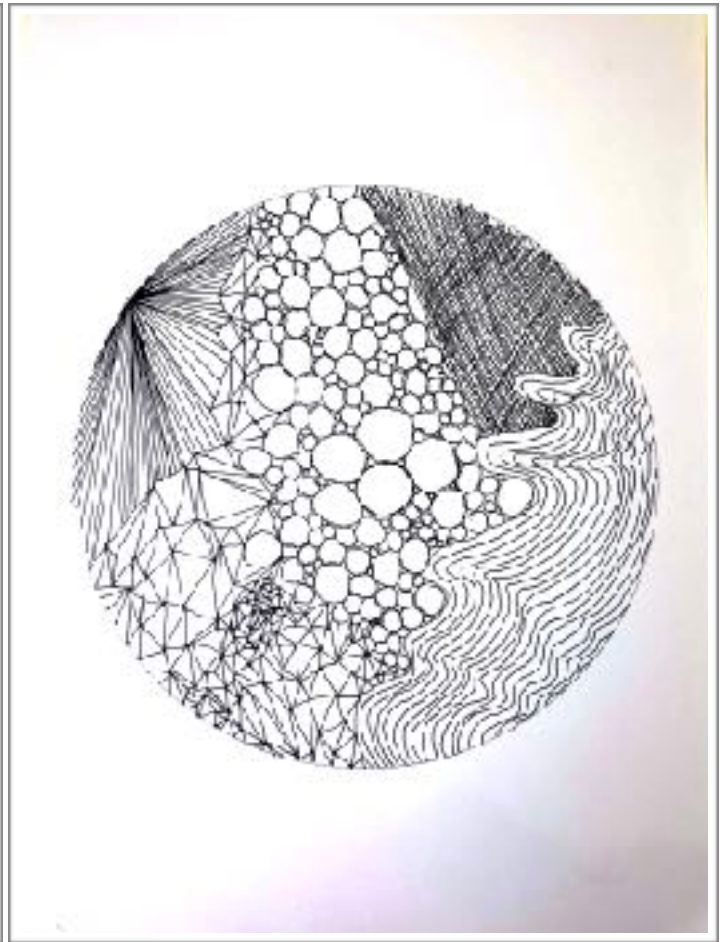


You will need:

- Piece of blank white paper
- Pencil
- A plate or a bowl to draw around

Art material options

- Coloured pens
- Black pen
- Biro
- Pencils
- Charcoal
- Whatever you can make a mark on paper with!



First Step:

Using your plate or bowl, draw a large circle in the centre of your paper. If you have no bowl you can freehand the circle, but try and keep the circle as neat as possible.



Example 1:

This one I wanted to draw a rough landscape. So I started by drawing across vague mountain shapes and hills, and then filled the entire circle with colour, and then went over with fine lines of texture.



Example 2:

I wanted to explore a single line texture and built this out from a small shape.



Example 3:

This one is more fun and imaginative, I wanted to draw bubble like things and a flower.



Example 4:

Explore different lines and textures you can make with just a pen, or a biro, make sure you fill the whole circle.
